GOVERNOR INFORMATION



Hello and welcome to our governor information sheet. This will tell you some information about the role of the Governors and allow us to introduce ourselves. The school website also has more detailed information on our role.

What is the role of the AGC? The Board of Trustees of the Futura Learning Partnership appoint a body known as an Academy Governing Committee (or AGC) to carry out some of its functions in individual schools.


The Trust Board is the accountable body and it delegates to the AGC which is made up of volunteers. This AGC must work as a body- no governor can act alone and they all carry equal responsibility for decisions made.

The overriding concern of all local governors is the welfare of their school and the Trust, and we are all committed to supporting Saltford on its journey.

The AGC monitors the school, engages with its stakeholders and reports back to the Trust Board. It monitors things such as safeguarding, leadership and management, school development, budget, appropriate use of grants and staffing.

Who Makes Up our Academy Governing Committee? It is comprised of 13 governors, including the Headteacher. This includes 3 foundation governors - appointed by the diocese on the basis of their knowledge, skills and understanding as a Church School.

The AGC is led by the Chair of Governors and whose appointment is ratified by the Trust. The Chair is supported by a Vice Chair, who is elected by the AGC.



Staff Governors



Dawn Sage has twenty-five years' experience of both teaching and senior leadership roles in both the secondary and primary phase. She became the Deputy Headteacher of Saltford in 2001 and was appointed the permanent Headteacher in April 2015. Saltford School is an incredibly happy school and the children go on to their next stage well prepared and keen to continue their learning. Our broad, balanced and rich curriculum ensure we are also making precious memories during those important primary years.



Elizabeth Spincer is a Teacher Governor who first worked at Saltford School in 1992. She has taught for many years in both KS1 and KS2 and is currently the Deputy Head and Assessment Lead in the school. She teaches in Y3 and loves working with the School Council and our trainee teachers. Elizabeth has an MEd in Educational Management and Policy and has three teenage sons.



Nathan Styles is a Teacher Governor who has worked at Saltford School since 2014, initially as a Bath Spa Teacher and then as a full-time classroom teacher in year 5. He moved to year 6 in 2017 and is enjoying the privileges and challenges of working with the school's oldest children. He is also part of both the Science and English teams.

Parent Governors



Paul Cummings and his family moved to Saltford in 2019 and Paul was elected to the Governing Body in December 2020. Paul became Chair of Governors in December 2022.

He and his wife have two daughters in the school. Paul is a serving Army Officer.

Co-Opted Governors

She chairs the Curriculum Working Party, is link Governor for English and Assessment. She has also sat on the Futura Learning Trust Education and Standards Committee. Kathryn is a teacher at Saltford School and all three of her daughters have attended Saltford Primary School, with just the youngest now a current pupil.
