Curricular Information:

Compulsory national curriculum subjects at primary school are:

- English
- maths
- science
- design and technology
- history
- geography
- art and design
- music
- physical education (PE), including swimming
- computing
- a foreign language (at key stage 2)
- personal, social and health education (PSHE) (including compulsory work on Relationships Education)

In addition Religious Education is a statutory subject and must be taught, although it is not part of the National Curriculum.

Schools often also teach:

citizenship

Statutory Assessments at the end of each Key Stage (SATs and Teacher Assessments) have taken place :

A scaled score between 80 and 99 means that your child's test result was below the Y6 age related standard.

A scaled score between 100 and 109 means that your child's test result is at the Y6 age related standard.

A scaled score between 110 and 120 means that your child's test result is above the Y6 age related standard.

Your child's report will include information about whether he or she is meeting the end of year age-related expectations (WTS – working towards EXS – at the expected standard GDS – working at greater depth).
