Lime: Charlie H for a super effort with his home reading, doodles and general attitude to work in school!



The members of the Young Carers' Council spoke eloquently about the pride and challenge of being a young carer, and explained how schools can support them by recognising their role, checking in with them and giving them space and support when needed.
