The Anti-Bullying Alliance defines bullying as:


The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological.

If you have any concerns about your child being bullied, please make sure you speak to the class teacher straight away. Thanks to Miss Jupp for all her work on promoting anti-bullying.
