Year 4 Maths Challenge

Well done to all our amazing Y4 children who took part in the UK Mathematical Association Primary Maths Challenge. This is an annual challenge that is run for a selected group of children to challenge them in their mathematical understanding. They need to complete a series of questions in order to be awarded either a gold, silver or bronze certificate. The children who took part have been presented with their certificate in school. A sample question is shown below. Thank you to Mr Godwin and all our staff who helped to organise and run this challenge. Here is an example of the kind of question they had to solve:


