Bikeability

Years 3 & 4 have been out and about this week for their Bikeability training which promotes safe on-road cycling. It aims to encourage children to get on their bikes for leisure or to make a journey on their first road vehicle by giving them the confidence and necessary cycle skills to deal with real traffic. It also supports our school goal of encouraging active and sustainable travel where possible to and from school. In addition to their new skills, each child is given a badge and certificate to show that they can demonstrate the required skills.

Bikeability training is delivered through B&NES and taught by professional qualified cycling instructors.

Year 6 children have been offered the Bikeability Level 1 & 2 combined course which will take place in early June. Thank you to Mrs Rich for all her work in arranging and coordinating these sessions for our children.




Egg-lympics

Y6 visit the Lifeskills Centre in Bristol

Well done to all of the Year 6 children who attended the trip to the Lifeskills Centre on Wednesday. The children were able to put themselves into real-life situations where they had to look at issues like fire safety, danger around water; being safe around electricity and safety around trains and railway tracks. They were able to consider how long a car takes to stop, and what products children are not allowed to buy in a shop. One of the most important lessons the children learned from the day was how to call the emergency services and what to expect when they do (you can also ask your children who they thought was on the other end of the line!) They were also warned about the dangers of making a hoax call, and why it is important not to do this. We find that the Lifeskills trip gives Year 6 some vital skills for their future, and provides it in a fun and interesting way. Thank you to the adults who attended with us and to Mr Godwin and the staff who arranged and accompanied the visit. The centre told us that they are always looking for volunteers to work with groups who visit the centre, so if you are interested and have any spare time, I know they would appreciate you contacting them. Victoria Art Gallery in Bath The Wonderful World of the Ladybird Book Artists exhibition 19th Jan – 14th April


This colourful, family-friendly exhibition includes rare books, original artwork and artefacts, and reveals the important role of the illustrators in Ladybird's extraordinary success.
