Attendance matters – health appointments

There is a strong and proven link between children's attendance at school and their achievement and well-being throughout their lives.

Most children do not want to miss out on school and find it harder to get back into their learning when they may have missed a key lesson or two.

There may be times when your child has no choice but to stay off school but in the meantime you can support their learning by making appointments for the dentist, optician and doctor outside of school time.

If this is really not possible, it is expected that you make every effort to minimise the amount of time that the child is absent for the appointment and return immediately afterwards. Siblings must not also be taken out of school - this would be recorded as an unauthorised absence. If you have to make an appointment in school time, please get in touch with the school office to give as much notice as possible. The school may request confirmation of medical appointments or medical support of illness or injury. Medical evidence can include items such as a GP slip or letter, appointment card or letter, the original prescribed medication or the prescription itself.



Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
