#### **Coronation celebrations**


We had a lovely day on Friday looking forward to the King's Coronation and celebrations over the bank holiday.

#### Support the I Can & I Am bus if you can... sponsored Biathlon on Saturday.

You may remember that our Year 5s benefitted enormously from a visit from the I Can & I Am bus last year.

Following a 16 year teaching career and having been offered a job as Headmaster in 2012, James Shone was diagnosed with a brain tumour. Following 27 hours of brain surgery he unfortunately lost the majority of his sight. However, James is a man who embodies a positive attitude to life and a determination to turn setbacks into springboards. On Saturday he is embarking on a fundraising challenge with the I Can & I Am team.

He says "This year we have a very definite aim of purchasing and renovating a much needed second I Can & I Am bus. The first bus is now fully booked for many months in advance. The new bus will not only dramatically increase the visits we can make but it'll be more modern and able to travel further afield.

"This year's challenge is a biathlon taking place on Saturday 13th May. Based in the Wye Valley, we'll cycle a hard 10 mile course up and around Symonds Yet rock, followed by a quick change over to a 10 mile canoe safari in the afternoon. I'll be on the back of a tandem which is a particularly nerve wracking way of travelling uphill. I'll also be participating in the canoeing which won't be easy but I'll be sharing a canoe with one of the team who will act as navigator! We'd love your support towards this great adventure."
