Results are in for the Maths Challenge

Congratulations to those in Year 6 who took part in the UK Maths Trust Junior Challenge. This challenge is designed to encourage mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency. The challenge is designed for children in Year 7 or below, so well done to the children who attained a gold, silver or bronze certificate. It is very challenging.

Well done to Giorgio D who performed so well that he has been invited to take part in a further round in June. You can see an example question from the paper below:


