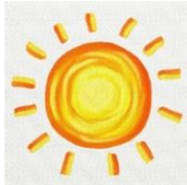

### Protection from the sun

Children are at school five days of the week at the hottest times of the day and we like to enjoy the positive aspects of being outside as much as we can. Staff will not apply sun screen to any child. Children can bring their own sun screen and apply it themselves; they may only use their own sun screen.

We ask parents to teach their children how to use and apply these screens sensibly and to label them clearly and ensure they are in your child's bag for their own use.

### Bee pollination project

On Tuesday Year 4 were treated to a visit from Mali and Marion from Bath Council and George and Steph from Avon Wildlife Trust to talk to the children about pollination. Over the course of the morning, the children discussed which insects acted as pollinators and how we could use the natural environment around us to encourage more insects and wildlife to the area. The children completed a Bioblitz, investigating how many different types of insects we already have in our school surroundings and then completed some amazing collage work linked to this theme.

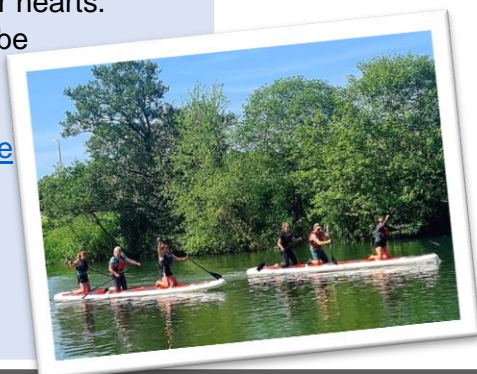
The girls have purchased components and made up fifty boxes which will be delivered in person from the Guides to the Hospice next week.
