#### Services for disabled children and befriending opportunities

Wecil is an organisation that offers a range of services for Disabled children and young people in different areas of B&NES. They work as part of the 'Space for Me' Partnership to deliver sessions in Bath and North East Somerset for Disabled Children and Young People between the ages of 5-21.

There are regular sessions for all age groups at Saltford Hall:

• Play Group: 5 - 8 year old group

Activities range from games nights, baking and trips to the park. The young people are welcome to bring a picnic dinner with them.

When: Every Tuesday during termtime, 4:15 – 5:45pm

• Youth Group: 8 - 13 year old group

 Activities range from cooking, to den building and movie nights. The young people are welcome to bring a picnic dinner with them.

When: Every Wednesday during termtime, 4:15 – 6:15pm

• Youth Group: 14 - 19 year old group

When: Every Wednesday during termtime, 6:30 – 8:30pm

There is also one 'out and about' session every 3 months to give the young people a chance to come together and enjoy local activities and visit locations further afield.

# BEFRIENDING SERVICE

Time2Share@WECIL is a Befriending Service that links Disabled children and young people 1:1 with a volunteer 'buddy'. They then spend time having fun and doing something they both enjoy!

Our volunteer Befrienders offer a supportive and reliable relationship to a child/young person who would otherwise be socially isolated. They can offer up to 2 hours of support per week and are recruited in line with Local Authority safer recruitment guidance, which includes enhanced DBS checks, training and references.

The service gives disabled children and young people an opportunity to go out independently, increase their self confidence, and enjoy activities with their Befriender.
