Welcome meetings next term

We strongly advise that you attend our welcome meetings that will be held early in the new term in the school hall. They are a precious opportunity for parents to meet the staff and to talk through the year to come. It is the ideal time to clear up any questions you may have. You will also be invited to visit the classrooms after the meeting. Do look out for details via MCAS.

The only year groups not having their meetings next term will be the new Reception classes and the new Y3 classes because they have already had their meetings.

Information for lower income families

We would like to remind you that schools receive additional funding (Pupil Premium) to support children.

If you are living on a low income and claiming certain benefits, please apply for free school meals under the 'benefit-related' free school meals scheme. When children are registered under this scheme, the school will receive extra funding, so please don't wait until after Year 2 to do this, even if your child receives the free school meals which every child in Reception, Y1 and Y2 is entitled to.

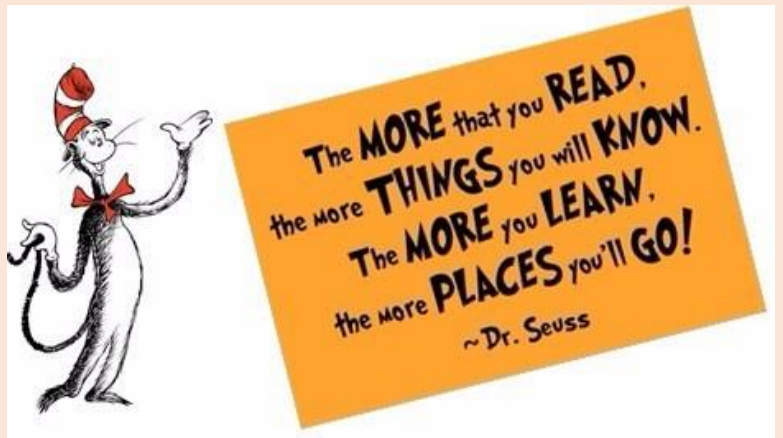

Goodbye and good luck to our Year 6 leavers Keep in touch!

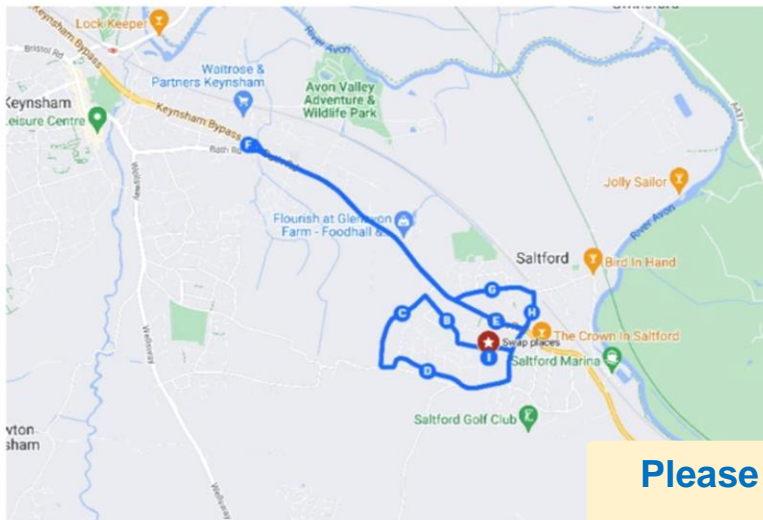
